Hi Cowboy

Camber Sands on the Sussex coast is good for riding. There is a large green area for parking. It is near Rye. I know there is a B&B for riders at Jevington in East Sussex, called The Paddocks, and that leads directly onto the south downs way. You can't get on the beach but you can ride along beachy head with some fantastic views of the sea. You can ride at Cooden Beach about 20 minute away, but you have to time your ride for the lowest tides. You could always spend a few days on the south Downs, then hit Camber Sands on the way back home. I think there are also some horse B&B places not too far away from Rye in Kent, if you want to make a week of it!
