Neoprene is great for normal use. Warning - do not use for extensive trail riding! The sweat underneath starts really soring up the horse. On the OTR ride across wyoming each year we find mohair string cinches and felt lined nylon work best. Like wise for saddle pads that have neoprene inserts. Keeps our vet busy!

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
